ENTRIES AND INFORMATION: Advanced entries requested. Entries are limited to 24 competitors. Post entries will be accepted up to the capacity of the range for the time allotted. Please email entries to: lewm@yrc.org or Lew Muller, 1120 17th Street West, Billings, MT 59102 - 406-252-5006.

ELIGIBILITY: Open to any member of the National Rifle Association. This is an YRC and not a NRA requirement. The YRC supports NRA membership.

RULES: Current NRA Conventional Pistol Rules will govern.

CLASSIFICATION: NRA Pistol classification will be used. Unclassified competitors will fire in the Master Class. Teams will not be classified. Competitors will not be placed in categories.

SCORING: Competitors will score. Competitors will be responsible for repairing and placing targets on frames. The plug type scoring device is restricted to use by the Match and Range Officials.

CHALLENGES: \$1.00 – see NRA Rule 16.1 for correct procedure.

REGISTRATION: \$10.00

ENTRY FEES: Individual Matches - \$2.00 per match, Team Matches - \$8.00 per team per match.

TEAMS: Teams will consist of four (4) firing members. All team members must represent the same NRA affiliated organization, military unit or police unit. Teams will not be classified or placed in categories. State Association teams are allowed.

AWARDS: First, Second and Third place open awards in the Regional Championships and first place awards in the Team matches are provided by the NRA. All other awards will be primarily NRA Award Points. Awards to match winner, 1st place award in each class, 2nd place if five or more in each class, 3rd place award if ten or more in each class.

MATCH SCHEDULE: Firing starts at 8:30 AM both days. Saturday firing will consist of .22 Cal and Center Fire plus their respective team matches. Sunday will be .45 Cal and Team. The CMP EIC Leg match will follow immediately after the .45 Cal. Team Match. This schedule may be changed at the discretion of the Match Director.

CMP SERVICE PISTOL EXCELLENCE IN COMPETITION MATCH

Held At
2010 Regional Pistol Championships
Billings, Montana
June 13, 2010

OPEN TO: Any competitor 16 years of age and older, subject to the regulations provided by the Civilian Marksmanship Program. Military Personnel may enter who comply with the applicable service regulations. This match may not be fired for practice. Competitors will certify their eligibility to enter on their score cards.

ENTRIES: Limited to 48 competitors

MATCH FIRED: Immediately following the .45 Cal. Team Match.

ENTRY FEE: \$10:00. This fee must be paid in cash by all competitors.

COURSE of FIRE: (10 shots on each target)

1st Stage: Slow Fire, 50 yards, NRA B6 Pistol Target.
One series of 10 shots, 10 minutes.

2nd Stage: Timed Fire, 25 yards, NRA B8 Pistol Target.
2 series of 5 shots, 20 seconds per series.

3rd Stage: Rapid Fire, 25 yards, NRA B8 Pistol Target.
2 series of 5 shots, 10 seconds per series.

ARMS: Pistol, U.S. Caliber .45 M1911A1, Service or Match Grade or the commercial equivalent thereof, as prescribed for use in the National Matches.

U.S. Pistol, 9MM, 9M or a commercial pistol of same design and caliber.

See CMP Competition Rules for specific requirements.

AMMUNITION: Pistol ammunition is any safe .45 caliber 230 grain, full metal jacket, round nose or any safe 9MM 115 to 125 grain, full metal jacket, round nose.

AWARDS: Credit toward distinguished designation and award of appropriate Excellence In Competition badges will be awarded to those civilian competitors who qualify for same as provided by the CMP. Military personnel will receive credit, if earned, from their respective service headquarters.
